Collection in your area will be during the week of:

[16 August to 20 August 2010]

Please have your rubbish on the berm by 7am on the Monday.

Please ensure that pathways and driveways are kept clear.

Frequently Asked Questions:

When can I start putting out my rubbish?

Not earlier than the weekend immediately before the collection date, but no later than 7am on the Monday.

What sort of rubbish can I put out?

We will collect:

- Household items
- Tyres (maximum of 4 per household)
- Appliances
- Furniture/Carpets
- Bric a Brac
- Solid, dry paint

We will NOT collect:

- Weekly household refuse**
- Garden waste and soil**
- Industrial, commercial and farm waste**
- Renovation and building waste**
- Bricks and broken concrete**
- Glass**
- Car bodies**
- Household renovation materials**
- Anything that cannot be lifted by two people onto the back of a truck**
- Hazardous waste such as:
- Asbestos/Fibrolite**
- Hazardous liquids*
- LPG gas cylinders and aerosol cans*
- Oil, and garden and household chemicals*
- Batteries*
- Used fluorescent tubes*
- Liquid paint**

*These items can be taken to the Hazmobile

Do I sort my rubbish?

Yes, separate trucks will collect tyres and metal for recycling, so if you are able to sort these into separate piles, it would help the collection.

Disposal of safety gear

If you are disposing of safety gear (e.g. bike helmet or child car seat) which is no longer fit for purpose, please smash it, or otherwise disable it, so it can not be reused by scavengers.

Is there anything else I need to know?

- Do not put out items too large or too heavy to be collected by two men.
- Take doors off fridges and stoves.

Who can use this inorganic collection service?

- Papakura District residents only. A \$400.00 instant fine will apply to ALL others.

Be Resourceful!

Don't put items out for the Inorganic Collection if they could be a useful resource for others in the community.
